An Excerpt from the Hippocratic Oath

I  by Apollo the , by Asclepius...and all the gods and goddesses, making them my witnesses, that I will  out, according to my ability and , this oath....

I will help the sick according to my ability and judgment, but never with a view to injury and wrongdoing. I will not give  to anybody when asked to do so, nor will I suggest such a course.... I will keep pure and  both my life and my art.... In whatever  I enter, I will enter to help the sick, and I will abstain [stay away] from all intentional wrongdoing and harm, especially from the pleasures of  with  or men, slave or free. And whatever I shall  or hear in the course of my profession, ... if it be what should not be published ,

I will never divulge [tell], keeping them to be secrets. Now if I carry out this oath, may I enjoy life forever and practice my skill, respected always among all men; if I break this oath or violate it, may the reverse be my lot.
